NAPLAN

This week students in years 3 and 5 are undertaking NAPLAN - The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy. This nationwide test assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life.

Students in Years 3 and 5 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

Premiers Reading Challenge 14th May – 24th August



I am delighted to invite all students to join in the 2018 Premier's Reading Challenge. Reading plays an important part in students' lives during their school years and beyond. It allows children to actively engage their imagination and opens up a world of educational opportunities. The reading period for the 2018 Premier's Reading Challenge commenced on Monday 14 May and closes Friday 24 August. This year the Premier has challenged all students from Prep to Year 2 to read or experience 20 books, Years 3 and 4 to read 20 books and Years 5 and 6 to read 15 books. Experiencing books can include shared reading, listening to stories, or reading picture books. The aim for the 2018 challenge is to engage more students than ever before.

Every student who completes the challenge will receive a Certificate of Achievement signed by the Premier. Students who participate but don't complete the challenge receive a Certificate of Participation from the school. It will be my great pleasure to present these certificates at our annual awards night with some bonus prizes for students who complete the challenge.

Head Lice

This week's reminder that They're back! Anyone, adults or children, can get head lice but unless everybody is aware of the need to check their children's scalps each week, it can be hard to control infestations. Effective control of head lice is not possible unless all parents are cooperative. This means regular inspections of children's hair and treatment (when needed).

There is no overnight cure but treatment presently available, if properly applied, will kill the lice. Treatment needs to be followed up in seven days in case of just one egg being missed. We suggest the whole family be treated, and other house items (hats, pillowcases, sheets, towels – upholstered furniture) be treated at the same time to prevent reinfestation.

AEDC

The **Australian Early Development Census (AEDC)** is a nationwide data collection of early childhood development at the time children commence their first year of full-time school. The AEDC highlights what is working well and what needs to be improved or developed to support children and their families by providing evidence to support health, education and community policy and planning. The Instrument collects data relating to five key areas of early childhood development referred to as 'domains', these include: Physical health and well-being, Social competence, Emotional maturity, Language and cognitive skills and Communication skills and general knowledge.
